Magnify Sandhurst

Catholic Education Sandhurst rolled out *Magnify Sandhurst*, an evidence-informed, science of learning school improvement initiative, to its 51 Catholic schools across the Sandhurst Diocese at the beginning of 2025.

Magnify Sandhurst focuses on how the brain learns, how literacy is effectively taught, uses a low variance, knowledge-rich curriculum and the creation of positive classrooms. Our practice is calm, predictable, and repeatable to maximise learning time in all classrooms.

Magnify Sandhurst is deliberately bold and wide-ranging, generating whole-of-system improvement.

We have partnered with world-class organisations including LME Global, Ochre Education, Knowledge Society, Steplab and MultiLit.

Magnify Sandhurst aims to enhance learning outcomes through several key components:

STRUCTURED AND EVIDENCE-BASED LEARNING

Using the latest neuroscience and a structured, knowledge-rich curriculum, we ensure students build deep understanding.

A low-variance curriculum provides students with a consistent learning experience and reduces the amount of preparation and planning required by teachers, allowing teachers to focus on individual student needs.

MAGNIFYING LITERACY AND NUMERACY

Providing targeted support and resources to improve reading, writing, and math skills at all levels. Special focus on structured literacy in F-2 and sequential programs from Years 3-10.

INSTRUCTIONAL COACHING FOR TEACHERS

Each teacher receives a dedicated coach and program to learn and practice the best techniques to meet students' learning needs. We are investing in our teachers to provide the best possible learning outcomes for students in our Catholic schools.

CALM CLASSROOMS AND POSITIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS

Promoting calm, supportive, and positive learning environments through common practices, expectations, and social norms, our work includes a new program for student social and behavioural learning. Our classrooms will have a consistent approach throughout each Sandhurst school to support all students to learn in a calm, orderly learning environment.



Chiltern, Victoria

Live, work, explore

Tucked between the rolling hills of the Chiltern–Mt Pilot National Park, Chiltern is a charming gold-rush era town that blends rich history with natural beauty and old-fashioned country hospitality.

Located just off the Hume Highway in North East Victoria, Chiltern offers a peaceful village lifestyle within easy reach of larger regional centres like Wodonga and Wangaratta. Its wide verandahs, historic facades and tree-lined streets tell the story of the 1850s goldfields, while the town today welcomes visitors and residents with warmth, character and community spirit.

Weekends in Chiltern invite you to slow down and step back in time – fossick through antique stores, explore the Rex Fuge History Walk, or visit one of the 20 National Trust-registered buildings, including the former courthouse, post office, and the iconic Dow's Pharmacy.

Literature lovers can visit Lakeview House, the former home of Henry Handel Richardson, author of *The Getting of Wisdom*.

Just beyond the town, nature lovers can explore bushwalking trails, uncover Indigenous rock art, or spot native wildlife in the Chiltern–Mt Pilot National Park. Mount Pilot Lookout offers breathtaking views across the region, while forest trails provide a peaceful escape just minutes from town.

With a strong sense of identity, an active local community and a deeply rooted connection to its past, Chiltern is a place where history and heart come together – offering the perfect setting to lead boldly during the week and unwind with nature on the weekend.

St Joseph's Primary School is a small, nurturing Catholic school community known for its welcoming atmosphere.

At the heart of the school is a dedicated team of educators and support staff who work in partnership with students, families and the local parish to create a safe, inclusive and faith-filled learning environment.

Catholic identity is central to school life, with students encouraged to live out Gospel values in their learning and relationships.

There are 32 children across Foundation through to Grade Six, with a team of staff including teachers, education support officers and administration officers.
